FIRST-YEAR - IMAGINE	<ul> <li>ACADEMIC</li> <li>Meet with your faculty advisor regarding majors and future goals.</li> <li>Take introductory courses to sample majors of interest.</li> <li>Get to know your professors, actively participate in class.</li> <li>Develop solid study habits and a good GPA.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>CAREER</li> <li>Login to Handshake to peruse open jobs and internships, connect with students beyond NWU with similar career interests, and schedule career coaching appointments.</li> <li>Set up an appointment with a career coach in the Career Center to explore academic majors and career opportunities.</li> <li>Browse the resources in the Handshake resource library and on the Career Center website at career.nebrwesleyan.edu.</li> <li>Attend A MAJOR Event in the fall to learn about NWU majors from each department.</li> <li>Use the Career Assistance Network to connect with alumni working in your areas of interest. SOPHOMORE - INVESTIGATE	<ul> <li>Learn about career options for academic majors through faculty members.</li> <li>Begin to solidify your major, declare by your second semester.</li> <li>Develop an academic plan with your advisor according to degree requirements.</li> <li>Apply good study habits, maintain a strong GPA.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Begin to think about possible internship opportunities. Check out the Gaining Experience handouts in the Career Center for ideas and suggestions.</li> <li>Use the Career Assistance Network to shadow or do an informational interview with an alum in your field of interest.</li> <li>Develop and improve your resume with assistance from the Career Center. If seeking an internship, consider uploading your resume to Handshake for employers to view.</li> <li>Begin looking at seasonal/part-time employment related to your interests.</li> <li>Attend the Backpack to Briefcase Student/Employer Reception in the spring to explore potential employers and opportunities.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Join a professional organization related to your major.</li> <li>Seek leadership roles on campus.</li> <li>Look into studying abroad.</li> <li>Review and reaffirm your values, interests, personality and abilities.</li> <li>Participate in volunteer opportunities on campus or within the community.</li> </ul>
JUNIOR - INTERACT	<ul> <li>Talk with your advisor to make sure you're meeting academic requirements for graduation and discuss career options.</li> <li>Look into prestigious scholarship opportunities if continuing your education.</li> <li>Consider the possibility of an advanced degree.</li> <li>Class topic sparked an interest? Talk to professors regarding research opportunities.</li> <li>Maintain a solid GPA.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Research companies and work environments.</li> <li>Discuss career concerns with a career coach.</li> <li>Think about taking a practice graduate/professional school entrance exam.</li> <li>Meet NWU alumni through the Career Assistance Network to discuss transitioning to the workplace or to graduate school.</li> <li>Continue to hone your resume and have it critiqued by a career coach.</li> <li>Obtain an internship to explore a career field and gain practical experience. See internship listings in Handshake.</li> <li>Attend the Backpack to Briefcase Student/Employer Reception.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Explore post-college options.</li> <li>Develop a list of professional references and keep in close contact.</li> <li>Begin the application process for graduate or professional school and take entrance exams.</li> <li>Continue to gain practical experience through activities, employment and community involvement.</li> </ul>
SENIOR - IMPLEMENT	<ul> <li>Maintain a solid GFA.</li> <li>Meet regularly with your advisor, confirm graduation status.</li> <li>Fill out necessary graduation forms.</li> <li>Request letters of recommendation from faculty members.</li> <li>Maintain a solid GPA.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Ensure your resume and profile are updated in Handshake and use the platform to search for full-time job listings.</li> <li>Continue meeting with a career coach regarding your job search or graduate school application.</li> <li>Attend the Backpack to Briefcase Student/Employer Reception as well as other local career fairs.</li> <li>Have your resume, cover letter and/or graduate school essays critiqued by a career coach in the Career Center.</li> <li>Access employer information, graduate school resources and other job vacancy boards online.</li> <li>Ask alumni in the Career Assistance Network about prospective employers, job hunting and relocating.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Set aside specific time for your job search or your graduate school application process.</li> <li>Continue to network and tell others about your plans.</li> <li>Relocating? Visit cities of interest.</li> <li>Tell others of your after- graduation plans, seek advice and contacts.</li> <li>Let the Career Center know how it's going!</li> </ul>
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
